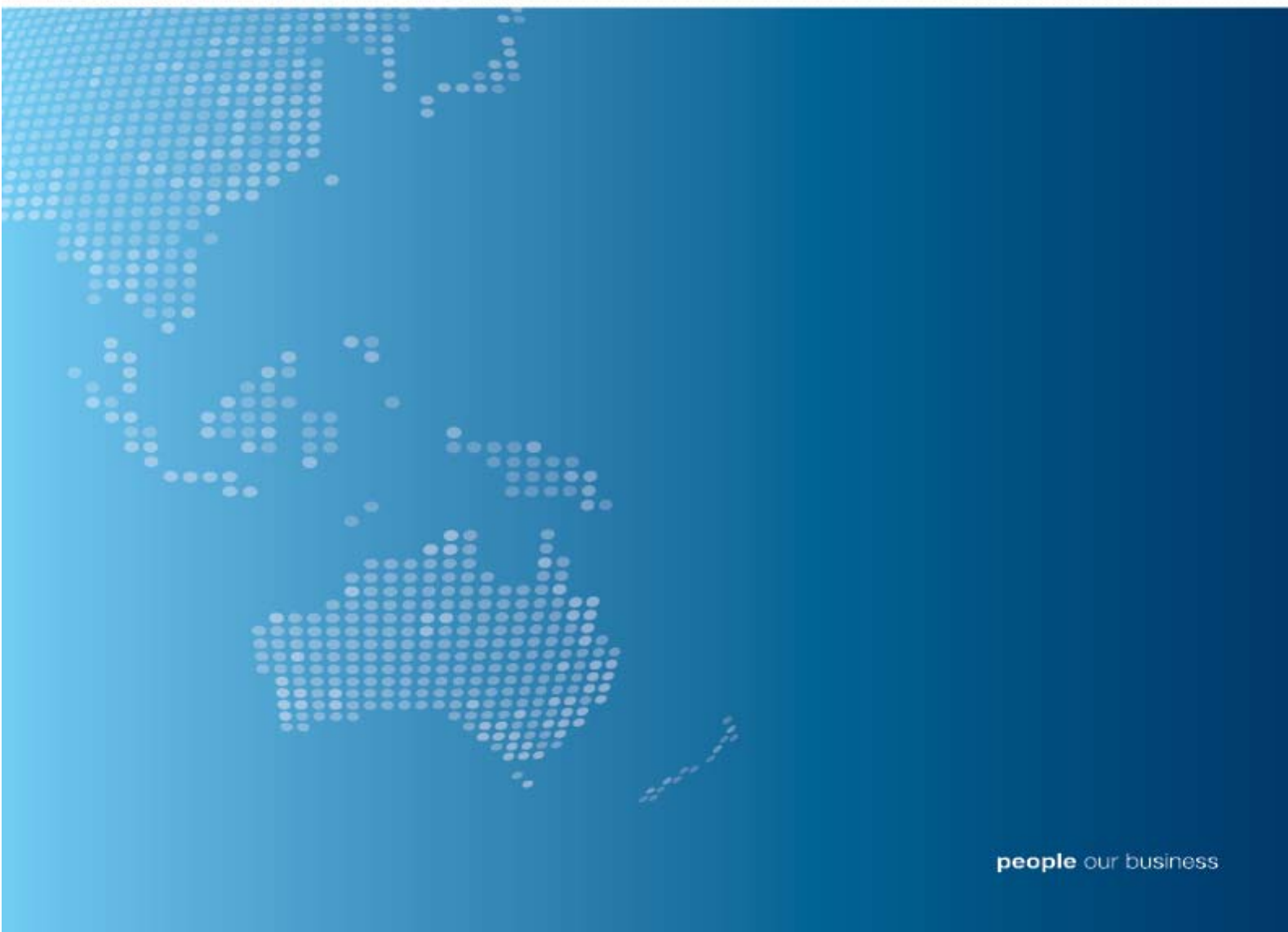
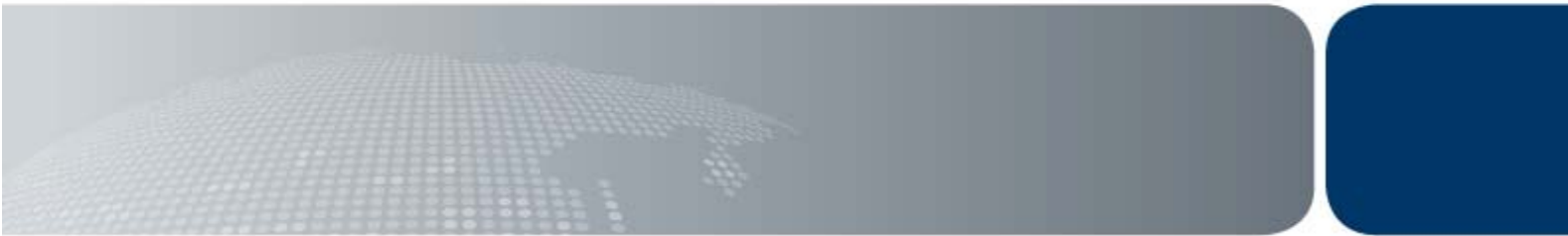

# Subclass 457 State/Territory summary report

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## Explanatory notes:

- Note 1** All numbers have been rounded to the nearest 10 and salaries to the nearest \$100. Therefore the sum of individual items in a table may not exactly match the total. Where a number in a table is between 1 and 4, the number has been masked with < 5 for privacy reasons.
- Note 2** This report is based on visa grant data recorded for visa subclass 457 in the current financial year and provides a comparison with the SAME PERIOD IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR. It excludes a small number of visa grants made to Independent Executives, who also used to enter on subclass 457 visa but are now included in the Business Skills categories.
- Note 3** The principal data collected on 457 visa holders comes from the visa application and grant process. The applicant and their sponsor provide a range of information to enable DIAC to assess the eligibility of the sponsor and the applicant for the visa. This is the most accurate and verifiable data that DIAC collects on 457 visa holders. It includes such information as the location of the nominated position, the nominated occupation, the nominated base salary and the citizenship country.
- Note 4** Unless otherwise stated, the tables in this report relate to primary applicants only.
- Note 5** Unless otherwise stated, the occupation shown in tables in this report is the nominated occupation. That is, the position that is being filled rather than the previous or usual occupation of the visa applicant.
- Note 6** Sponsors self-identify with an industry classification when lodging a nomination or sponsorship. The industry classification shown is based on what the sponsor has recorded. If a sponsor has notified more than one industry over time, the most recently recorded industry classification has been used in this report.
- Note 7** Up until 1 April 2005, medical practitioners applied for a visa in Visa Subclass 422 Medical Practitioner. From that date, medical practitioners have been encouraged to apply for a Subclass 457 visa.
- Note 8** In tables showing the top 15 citizenship countries, the figure for 'Unknown' is included in the total only.
- Note 9** In some tables, 'Not recorded' or 'Not specified' appears. This mainly relates to visa applications processed in the IRIS system. IRIS does not have the capacity to record comprehensive information about sponsors and nominations. Since 1 November 2003, the ICSE system has largely replaced IRIS for processing subclass 457 visas, but a small number of visas are still processed in IRIS.
- Note 10** From 14 September 2009, subclass 457 visa holders changing sponsor or nominated occupation do not need to lodge a new visa application if they held a valid subclass 457 visa. DIAC estimates that the number of visa applications lodged since 14 September 2009 has been reduced by on average 7.2% below the level that would have occurred without the change.

## Definition of Terms:

ANZSCO Major Group:	Major Group is the highest level in the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS).
ANZSIC:	Australian and New Zealand Standard Industry Classification 2006 Edition produced by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS). Prior to November 2008, ANZSIC 1993 was used to record industry. Data recorded using ANZSIC 1993 has been converted to ANZSIC 2006 using concordance tables provided by the ABS.
Applicant Type:	<p>Under the Migration Regulations 1994 (the Regulations), there are two types of applicants. These are primary applicants and secondary applicants. These terms are defined below.</p> <p>If the table or graph heading includes the word 'primary', such as 'primary applications' or 'primary visa holders', dependants are not included.</p>
Independent Executive:	Formerly, a group within subclass 457 who did not require a sponsor. They are now included in the Business Skills categories. A small number of visa applications for Independent Executives were finalised in the current year.
Last Visa Held:	This refers to the last substantive visa held by a visa holder (that is, the last visa other than a bridging visa) prior to a point in time. The last visa held may have expired or still be in effect.
Nominated Base Salary:	Represents the gross annual salary based on a 38 hour week that the employer has indicated they will pay to the primary visa holder. These amounts do not include the value of salary packaged items, bonuses, commissions or other payments listed in the schedule to the legislative instrument specifying Minimum Salary Levels for the Subclass 457 program.
Nominated Occupation:	The occupation of the nominated position that the primary visa holder will be filling in Australia while holding the Subclass 457 visa based on the Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) 1st Edition.
Nominated Position Location:	The State or Territory where the visa holder will be working. This may be different from the business address of the sponsor and/or the visa processing office.
Nominated Total Remuneration:	The total value of the salary package including base salary, allowances, bonuses and superannuation.
Pathway:	A visa holder moving from one type of visa to another type of visa. Most commonly used in relation to visa applicants moving from a temporary visa to a permanent/provisional visa. The original visa is determined by the last visa held prior to permanent/provisional visa grant and the visa applicant may be onshore or offshore.
Permanent/provisional visa:	A visa subclass which is countable for the purposes of the migration program.
Primary Applicant:	The primary applicant is the person who must satisfy the primary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Migration Regulations.
Primary Application:	An application lodged by a primary applicant.
Secondary Applicant:	Secondary applicants must satisfy the secondary criteria for the grant of a visa under the Regulations. In this case, a secondary applicant is generally a dependant of the primary applicant.
Secondary Application:	A visa application lodged by a secondary applicant.
Sponsor Industry:	The industry self-identified by the sponsoring client using the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industry Classification (ANZSIC) 2006 edition.

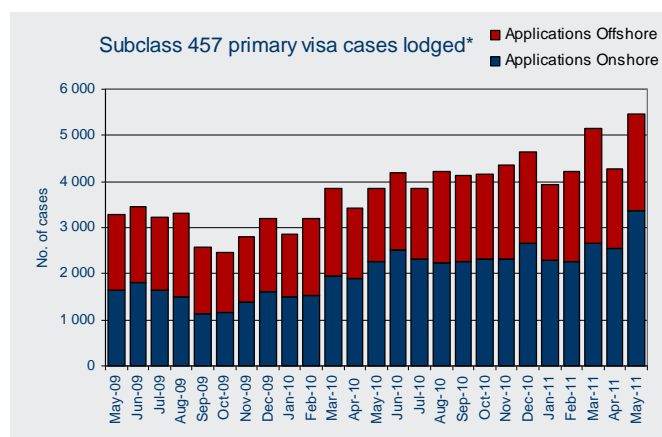
# Trends in the subclass 457 Business (Long Stay) visa program to May 2011

## Key points

- Subclass 457 primary visa application lodgements grew strongly in May 2011, reaching 5470. This is the highest number of monthly lodgements since November 2008.
- Offshore lodgements in particular continue to grow strongly and were 54.8 per cent higher than the same period last program year, reflecting strong employer demand for overseas skilled workers.
- The flow of subclass 457 visa holders to permanent residence is up 35.0 per cent from April 2011, but down 6.8 per cent compared to 2009-10 to the end of May 2010.

## Visa application trends<sup>1</sup>

The number of subclass 457 primary visa applications lodged to May 2011 was 39.4 per cent higher than the same period last program year. The number of applications lodged in May 2011 was 28.4 per cent higher than April 2011.



To the end of May 2011, offshore applications were 54.8 per cent higher than the same period last program year. Offshore applications for May 2011 were 32.1 per cent higher than April 2011.

To the end of May 2011, onshore applications were 23.6 per cent higher than the same period last program year. Onshore applications for May 2011 were 22.9 per cent higher than April 2011.

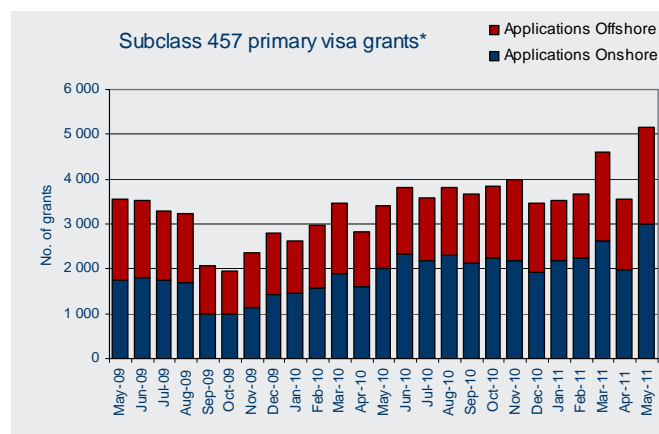
<sup>1</sup> Since 14 September 2009, Subclass 457 visa holders who wish to change employer or position (within the validity of their current visa) are not required to apply for a new Subclass 457 visa. This will affect comparisons between this program year and the previous program year. Also see Note 10 in the Explanatory Notes.

## Visa grant trends<sup>2</sup>

To the end of May 2011, subclass 457 primary visa grants were 38.3 per cent higher than the same time last program year. The number of visa grants in May 2011 was 45.0 per cent higher than April 2011.

To the end of May 2011, offshore grants were 50.9 per cent higher than the same period last program year. Offshore grants increased 51.7 per cent in May 2011 in comparison to April 2011.

To the end of May 2011, onshore grants were 24.0 per cent higher than the same period last program year. Onshore grants increased 36.6 per cent in May 2011 in comparison to April 2011.



In the period to the end of May 2011, 78.5 per cent of primary visa grants were to Managers and Professionals and 16.2 per cent were to Technicians and Trades Workers.<sup>3</sup>

The top three industries for primary visa grants in the period to 31 May 2011 were Health Care and Social Assistance (13.4 per cent), Other Services (12.5 per cent), and Construction (12.4 per cent).

<sup>2</sup> The rate at which visa applications are processed is subject to a number of variables including: the number of working days in a month, the number of public holidays and the occurrence of school holidays.

<sup>3</sup> The Department of Immigration and Citizenship replaced the Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO) with the Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) from 1 July 2010. This will affect comparisons between this program year and the previous program year.

The top three growth industries in the period to the end of May 2011 were Professional, Scientific and Technical (181.1 per cent increase compared to the same period in 2009-10), Other Services (97.4 per cent increase compared to the same period in 2009-10), and Construction (79.0 per cent increase compared to the same period in 2009-10).

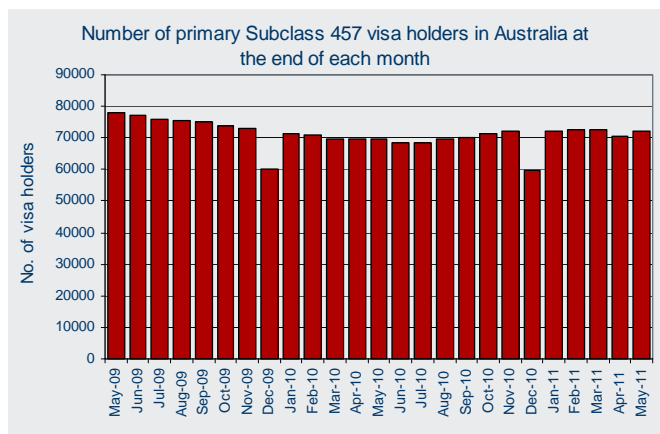
The top three occupations for primary visa grants to 31 May 2011 were Developer Programmer (4.1 per cent), Management Consultant (2.8 per cent) and Resident Medical Officer (2.7 per cent).

The majority of primary subclass 457 visa grants to the end of May 2011 were for positions in New South Wales (36.0 per cent), Victoria (24.1 per cent) and Western Australia (18.9 per cent).

The top three citizenship countries for primary visa grants to 31 May 2011 were the United Kingdom (24.9 per cent), India (18.0 per cent) and the Republic of Ireland (8.1 per cent).

## Number of primary subclass 457 visa holders in Australia

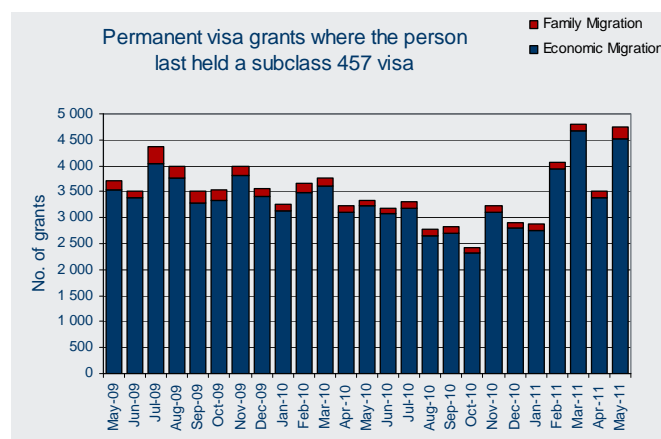
The number of primary visa holders in Australia at 31 May 2011 was 72 270, an increase of 4.0 per cent in comparison with the same date last year. The number of primary visa holders in Australia gradually trended upward from July 2010 to November 2010 and has plateaued since then.



## Flow of subclass 457 visa holders to permanent residence

To the end of May 2011, the number of subclass 457 visa holders granted a permanent residence visa was 6.8 per cent lower than the same period last program year. The number of subclass 457 visa holders granted a permanent residence visa in May 2011 was 35.0 per cent higher than April 2011. Both the May 2011 and March 2011 outcomes were significantly higher than average monthly outcomes over the last two years. This highlights the upward trend from October 2010.

The majority (96.2 per cent) were in the Economic Migration category and 3.8 per cent were in the Family category.



## Sanctions of sponsors

Employers who are approved as sponsors are monitored to ensure they are satisfying their sponsorship obligations. Prior to 14 September 2009, similar requirements were known as sponsorship undertakings. If the sponsor does not satisfy these obligations or undertakings, the department may take action against the sponsor. This may include imposing administrative sanctions (such as barring the sponsor from sponsoring more people or cancelling the approval of the sponsor), serving infringement notices or applying for a civil penalty order through the federal court.

There were 127 sponsors sanctioned to the end of May 2011 in the 2010-11 program year. This is 15.3 per cent lower than the same period last program year. The changes to the Subclass 457 visa program that came into effect with the *Migration Legislation Amendment (Worker Protection) Act 2008* on 14 September 2009 will affect comparisons with 2009-10.

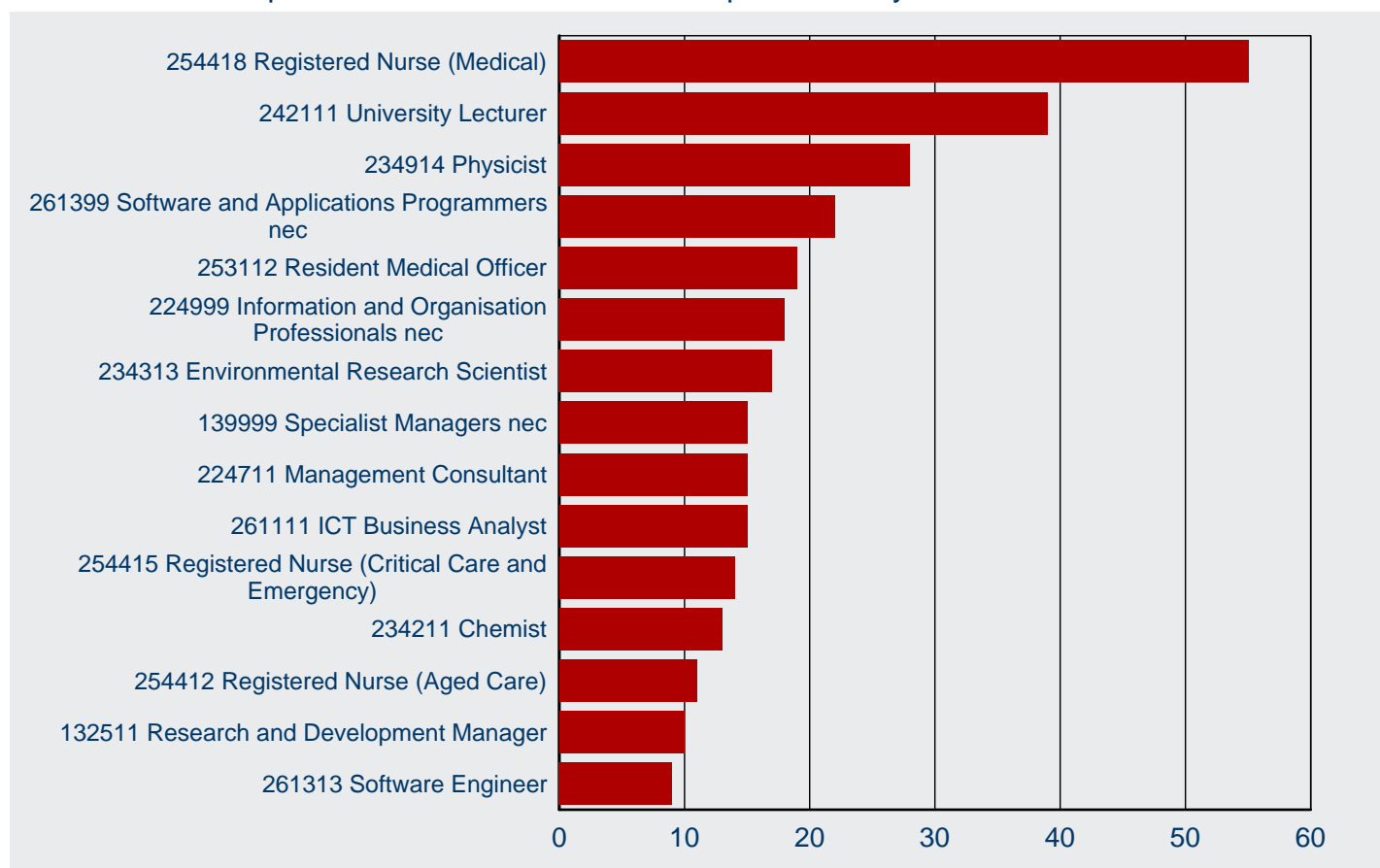

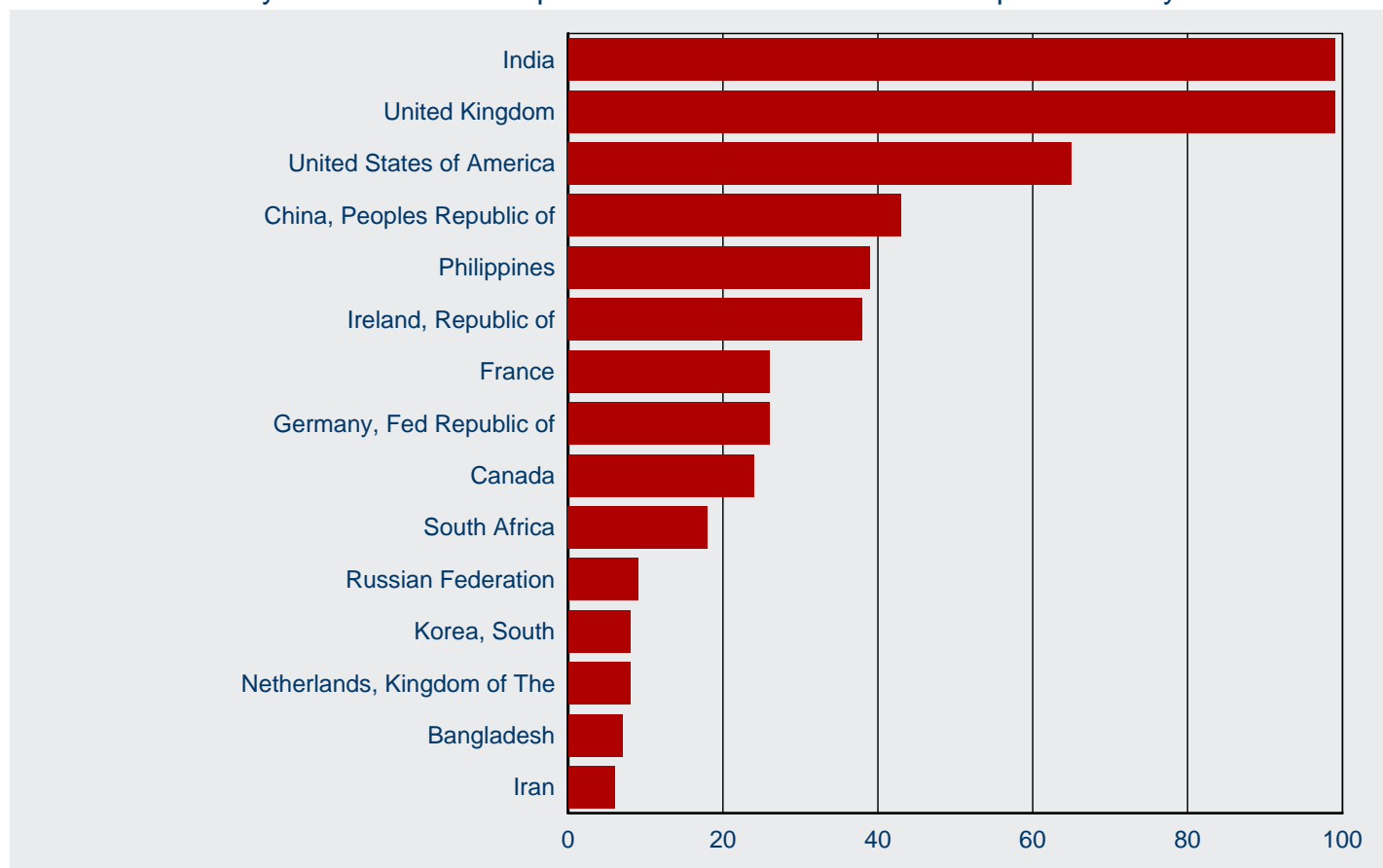

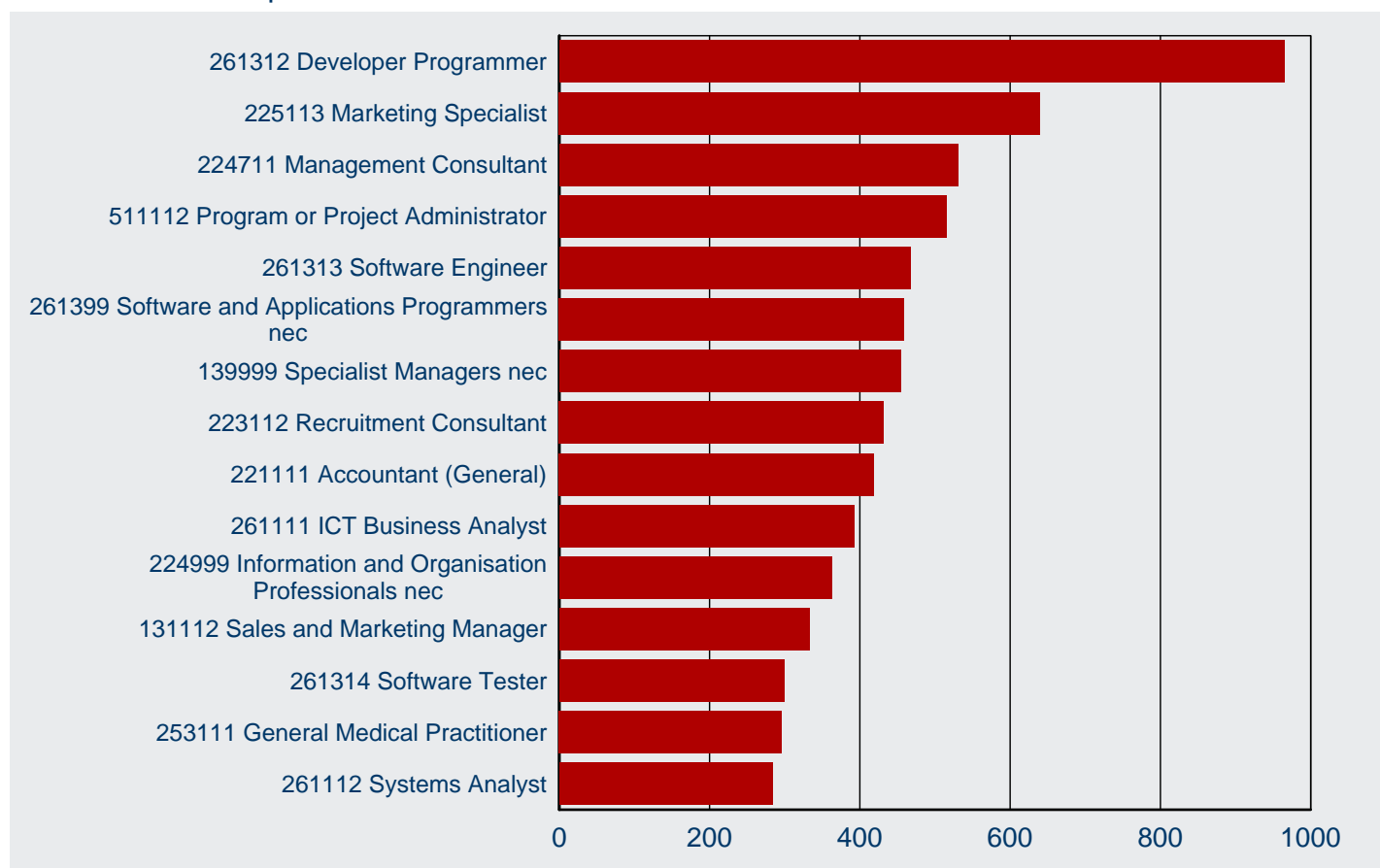

Graph 3.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2010-11 to 31 May 2011 - nominated positions located in New South Wales

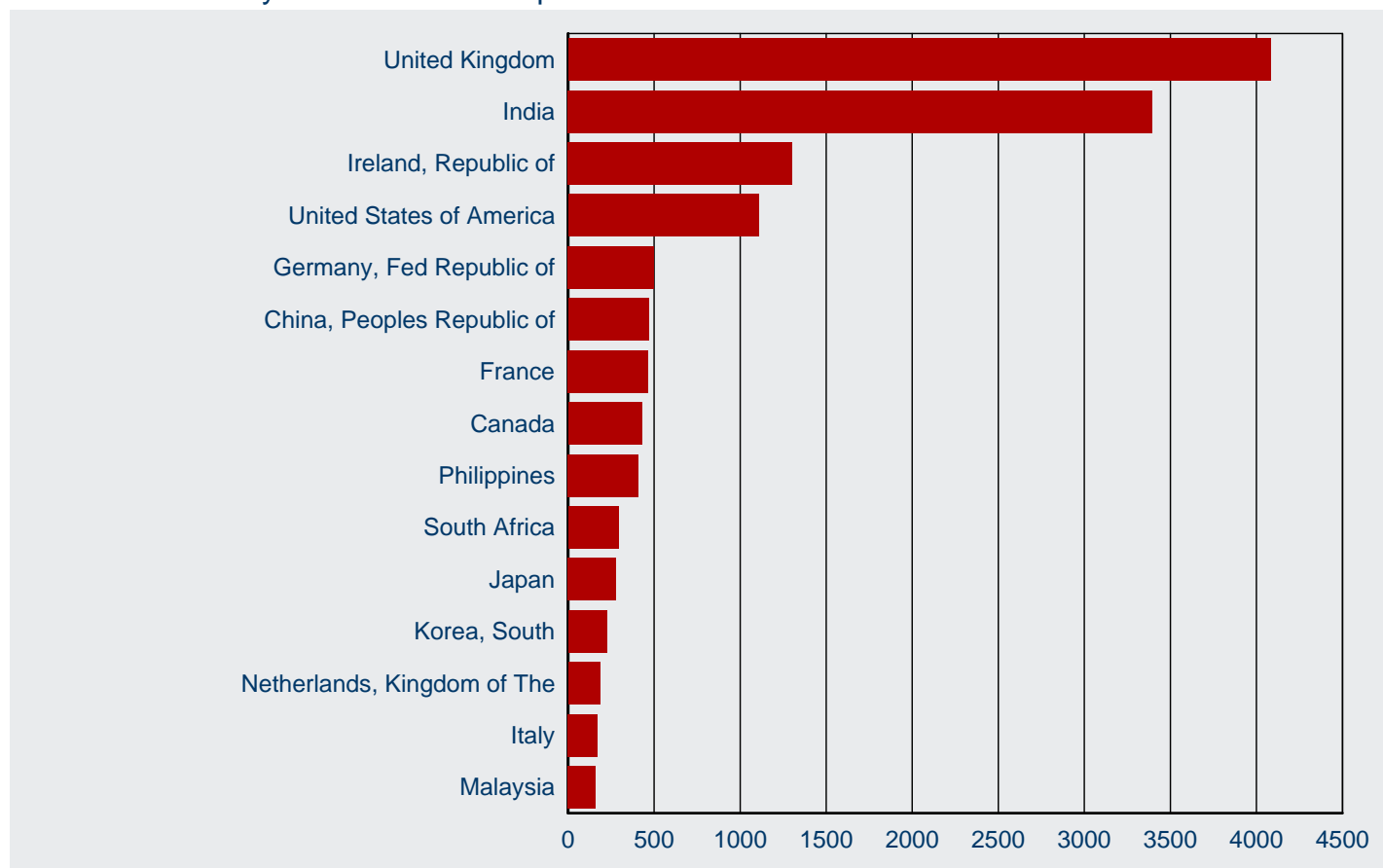

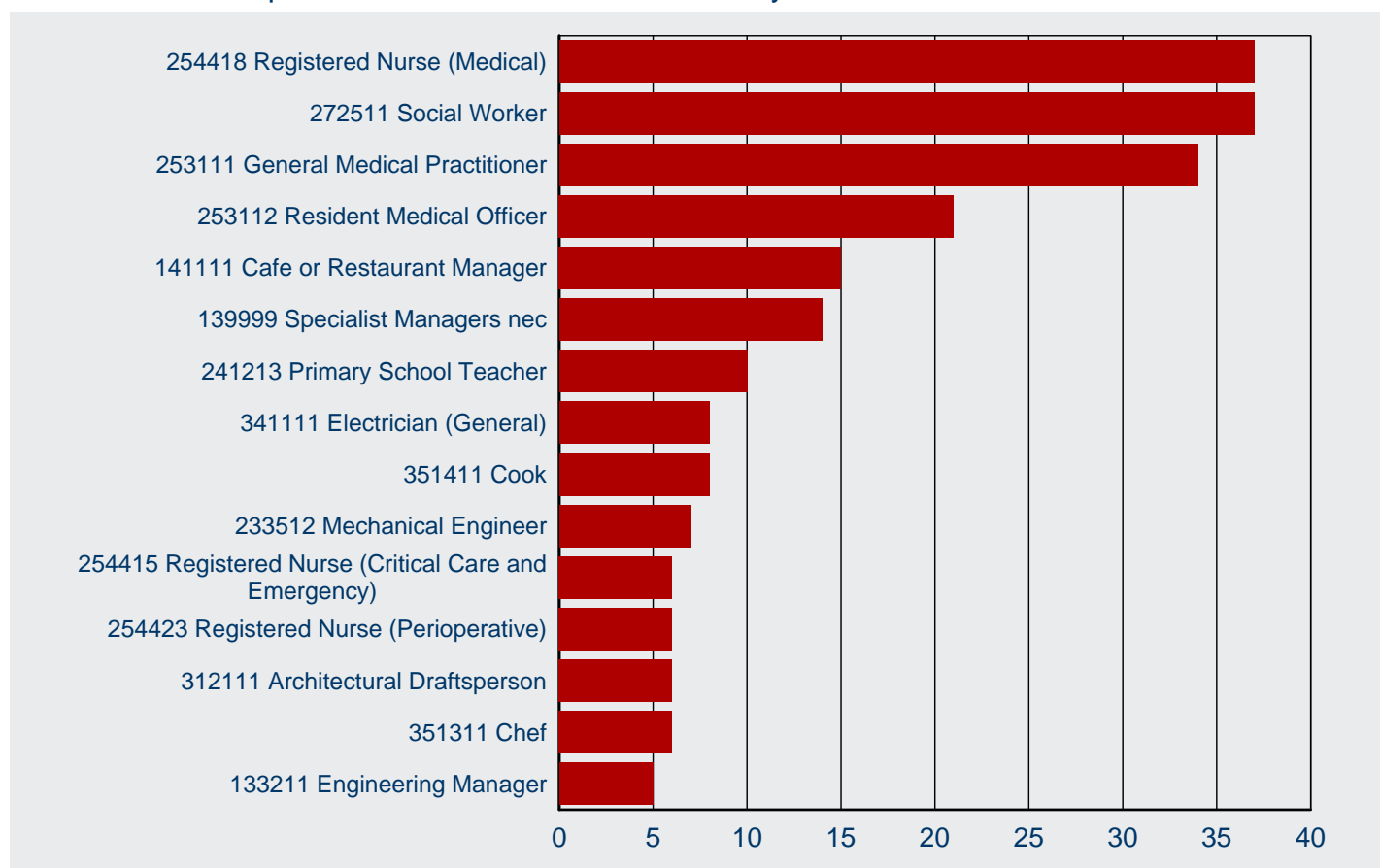

Graph 4.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2010-11 to 31 May 2011 - nominated positions located in Northern Territory

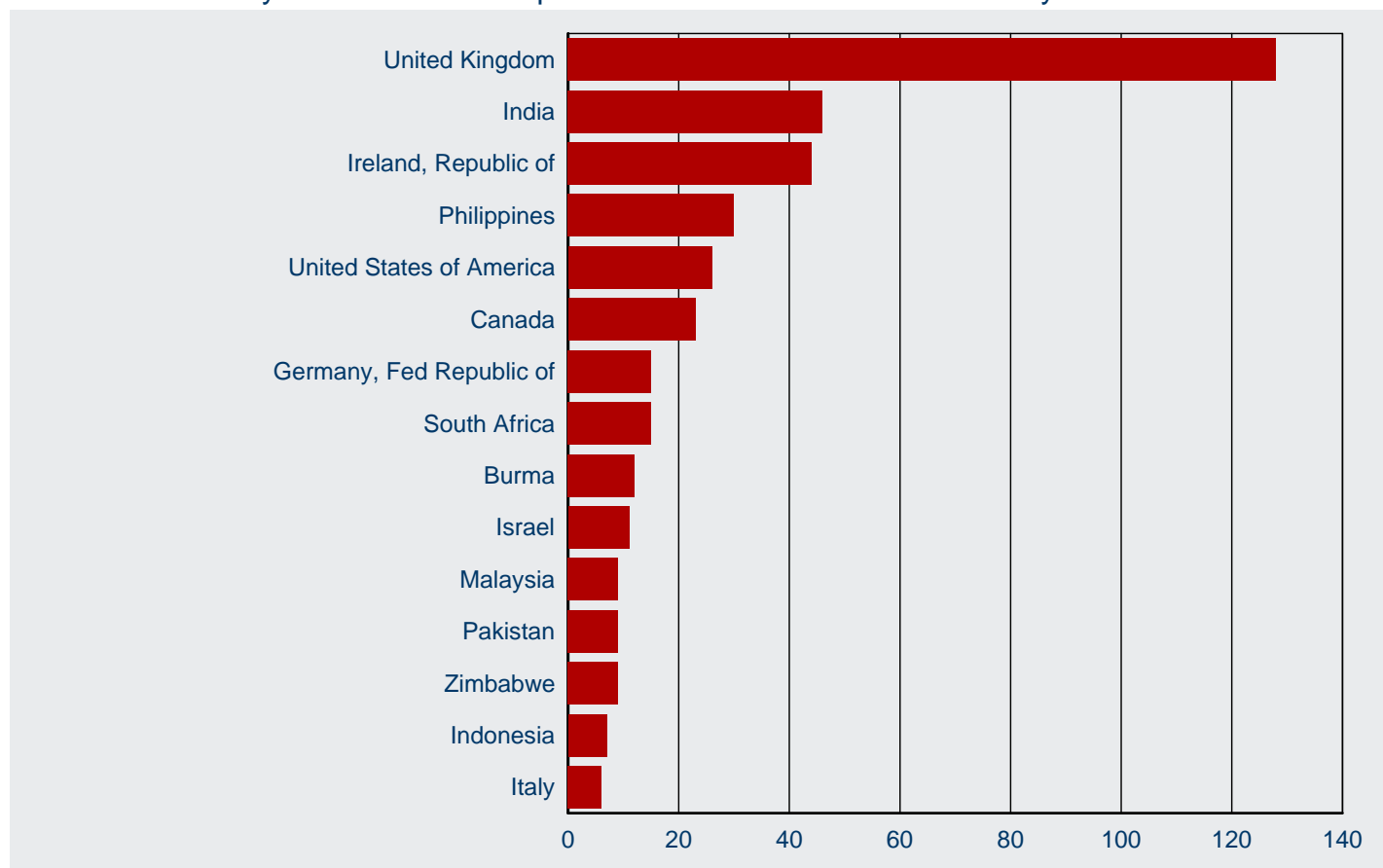

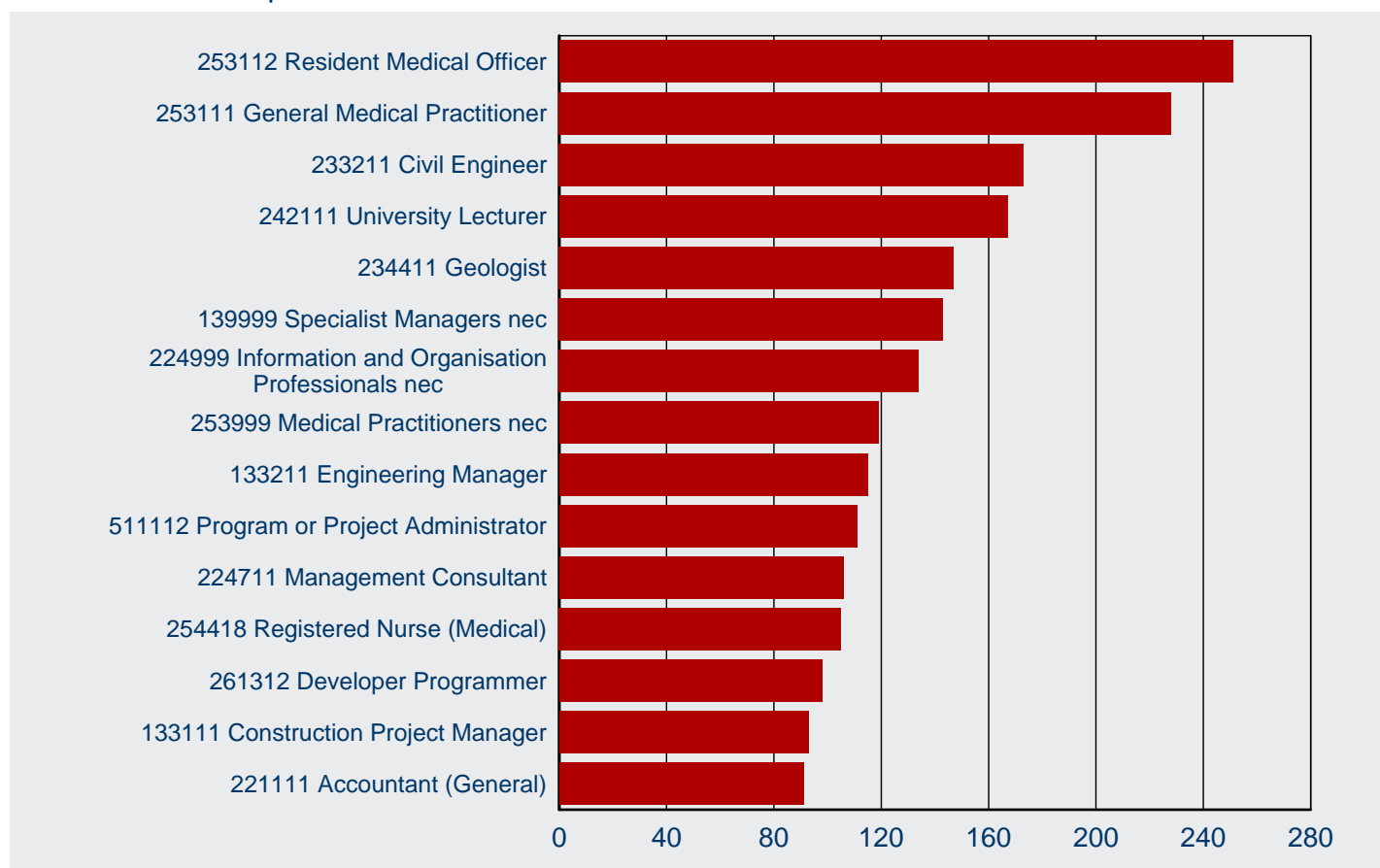

Graph 5.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2010-11 to 31 May 2011 - nominated positions located in Queensland

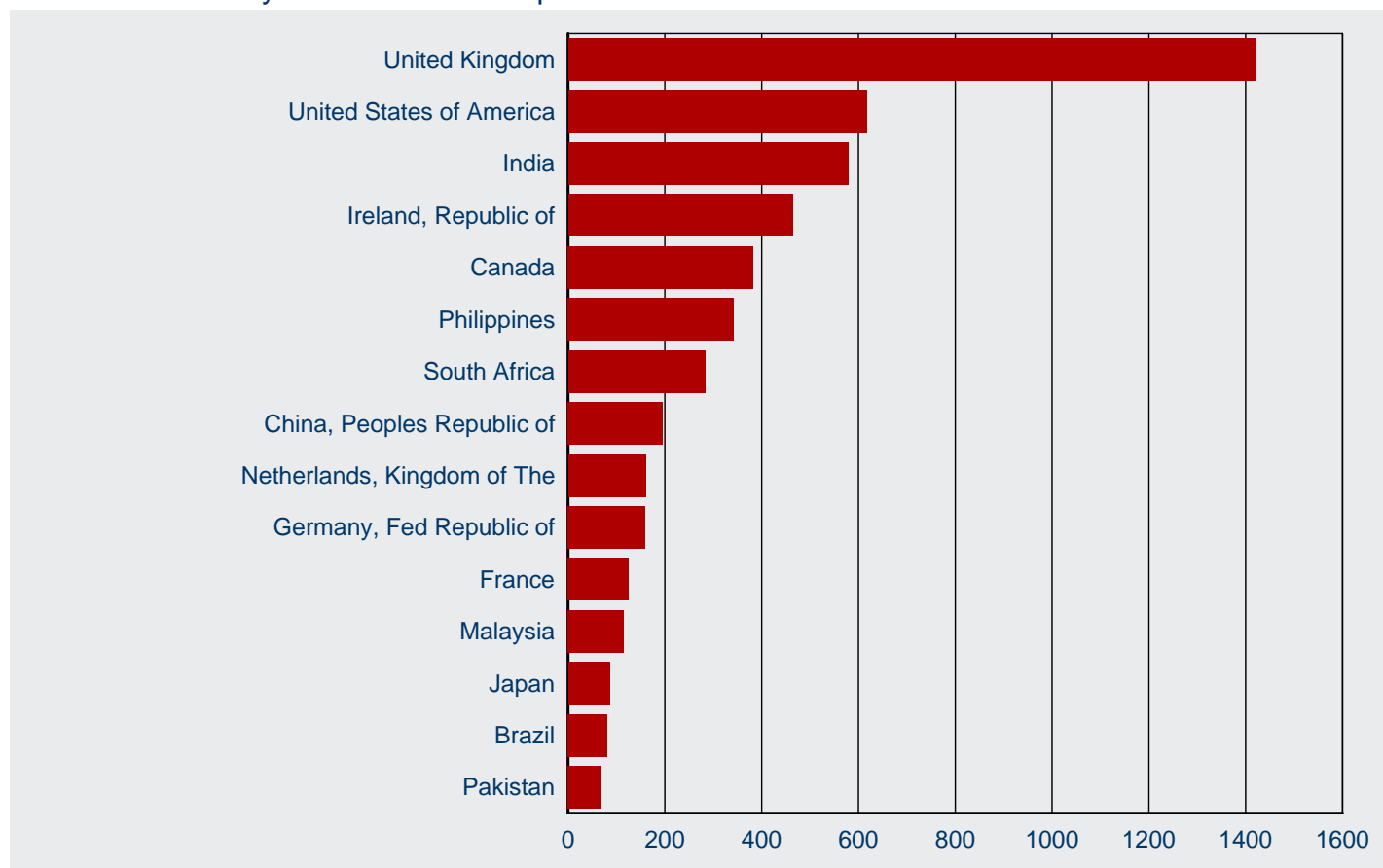

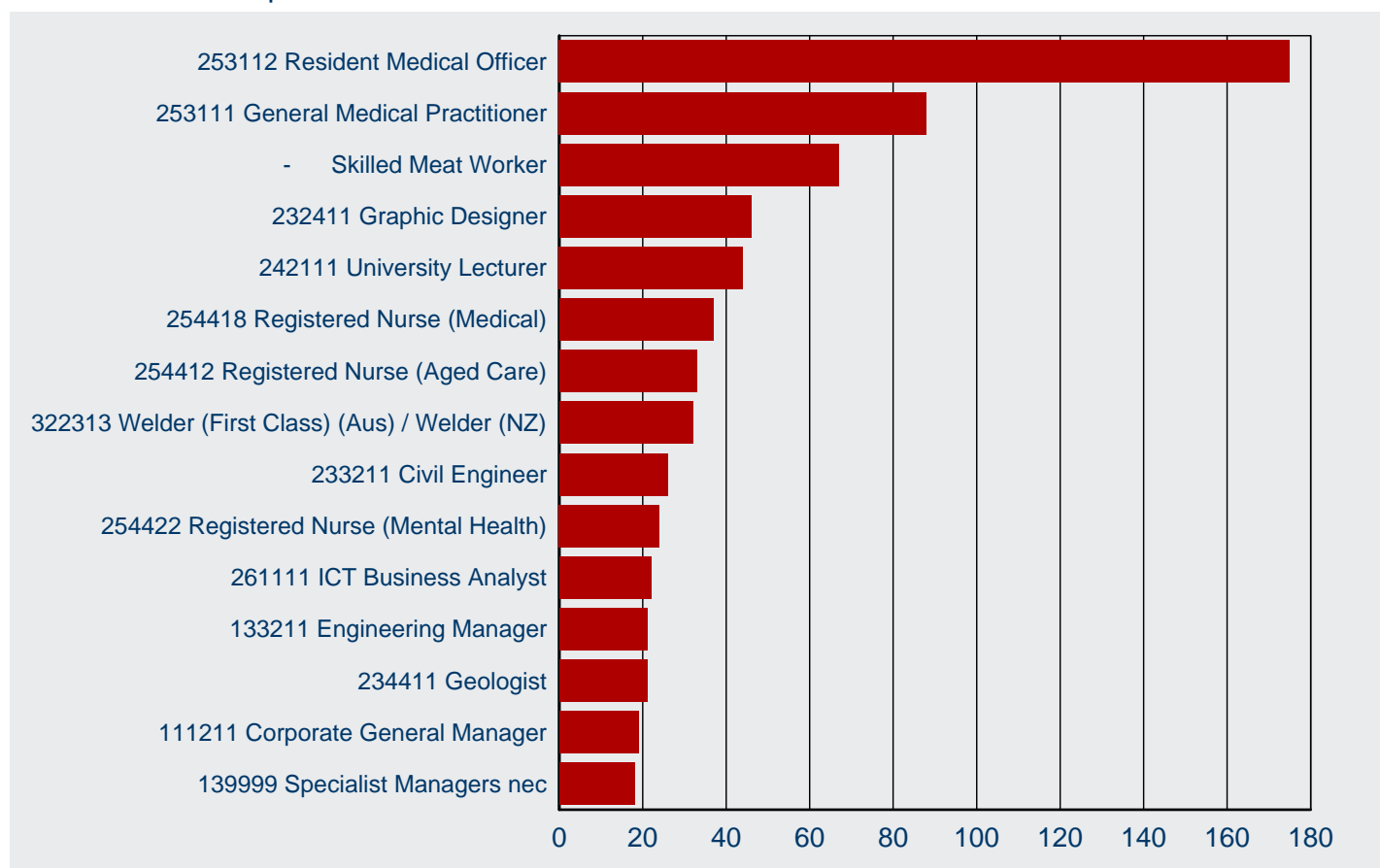

Graph 6.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2010-11 to 31 May 2011 - nominated positions located in South Australia

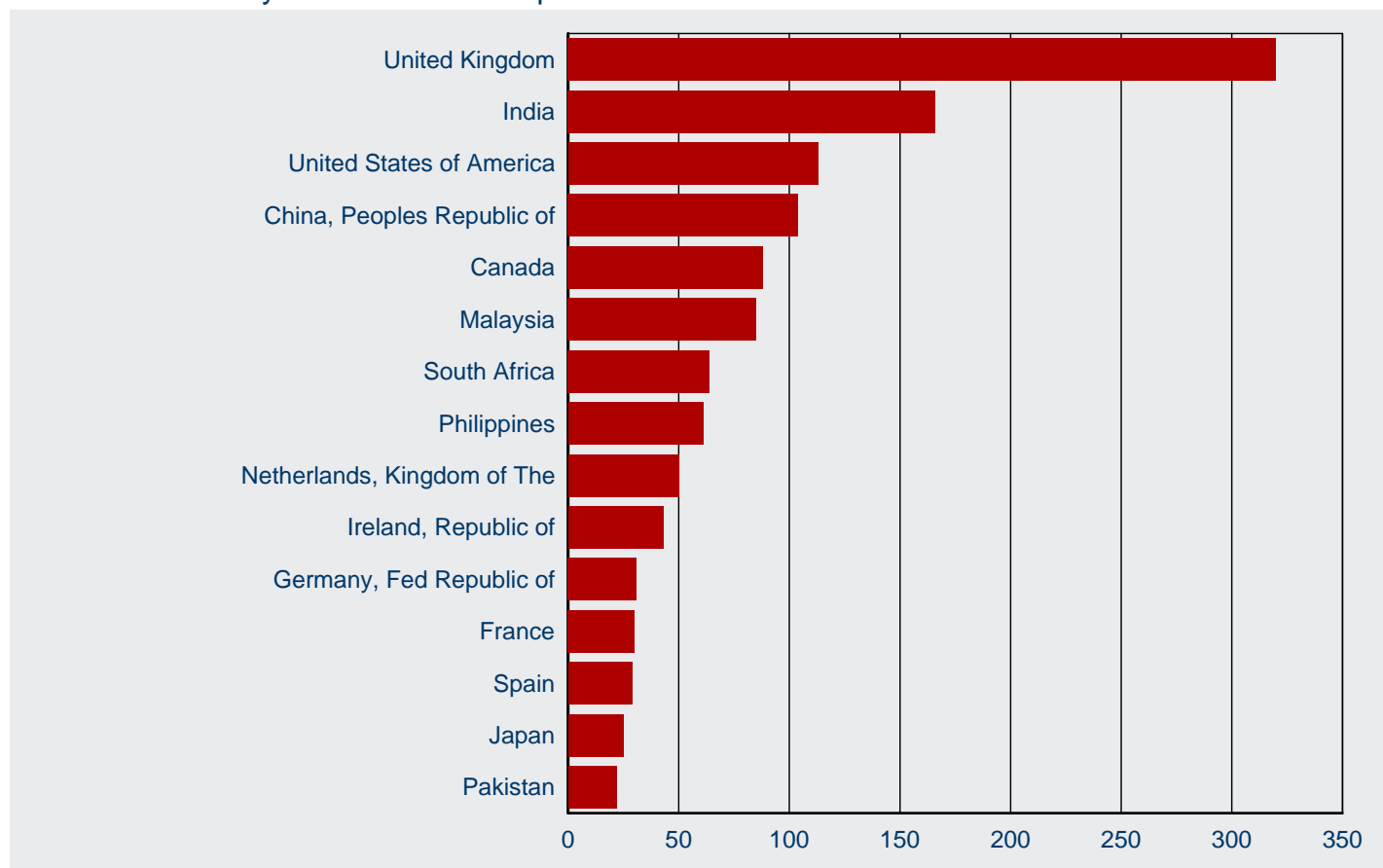

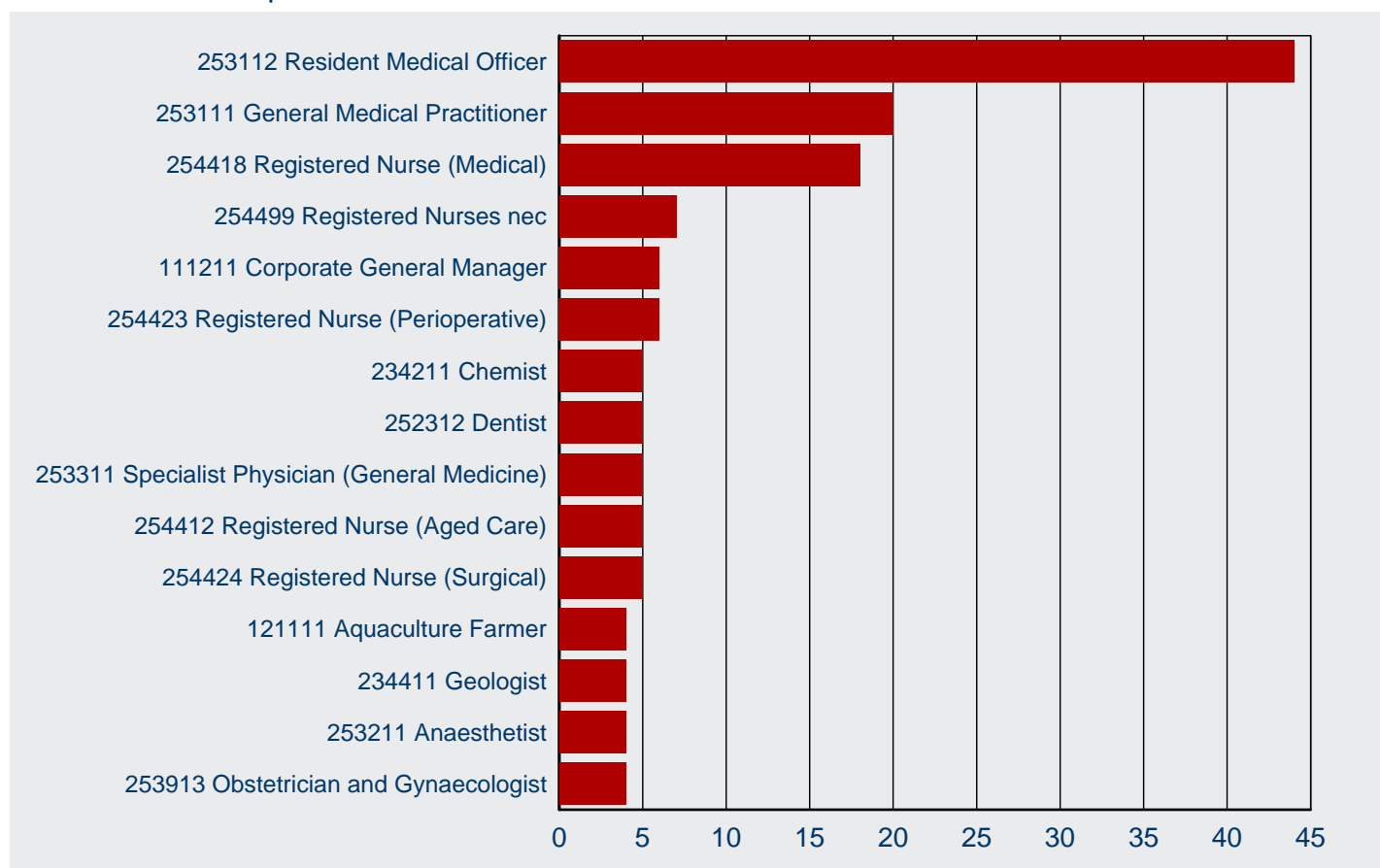

Graph 7.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2010-11 to 31 May 2011 - nominated positions located in Tasmania

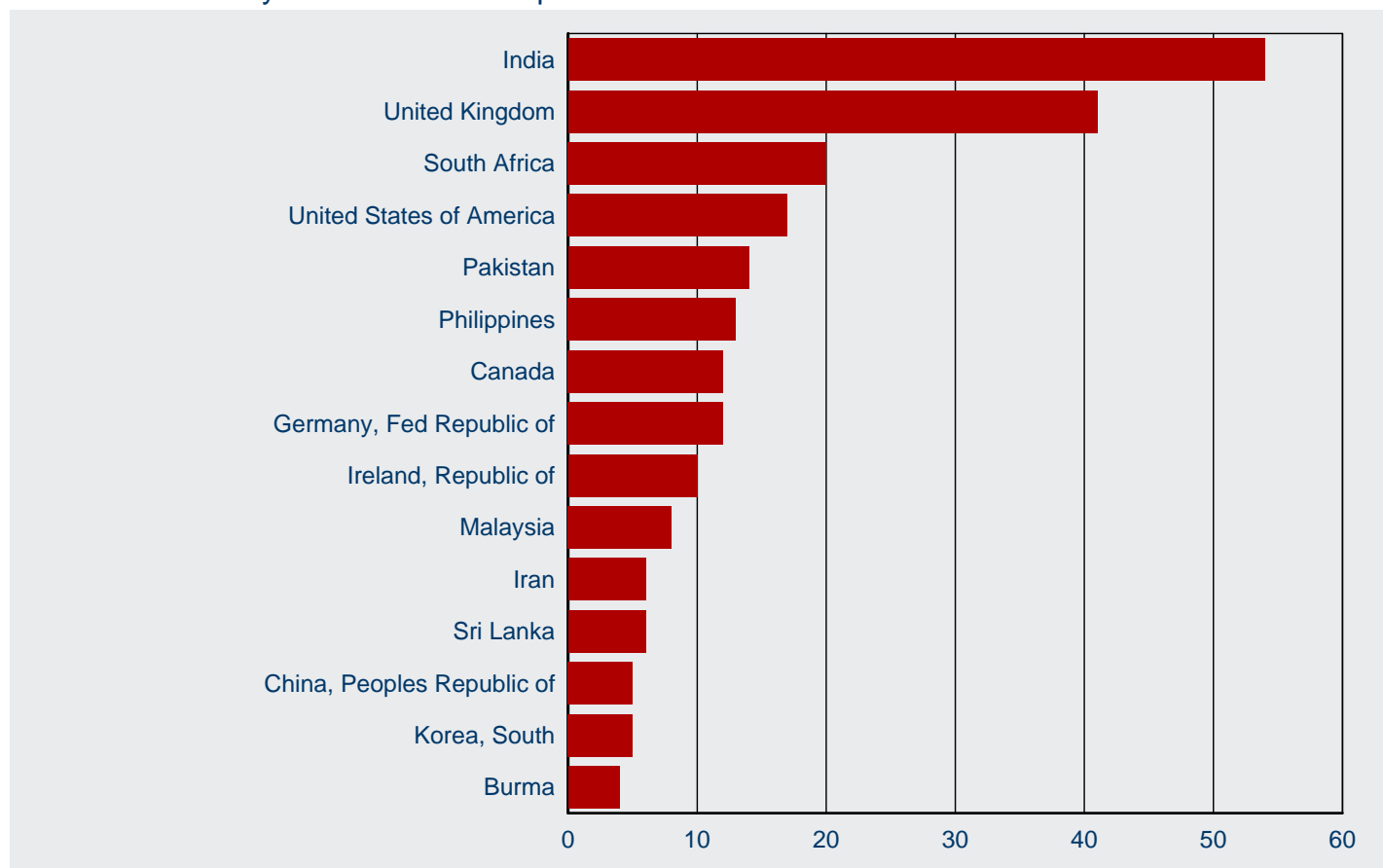

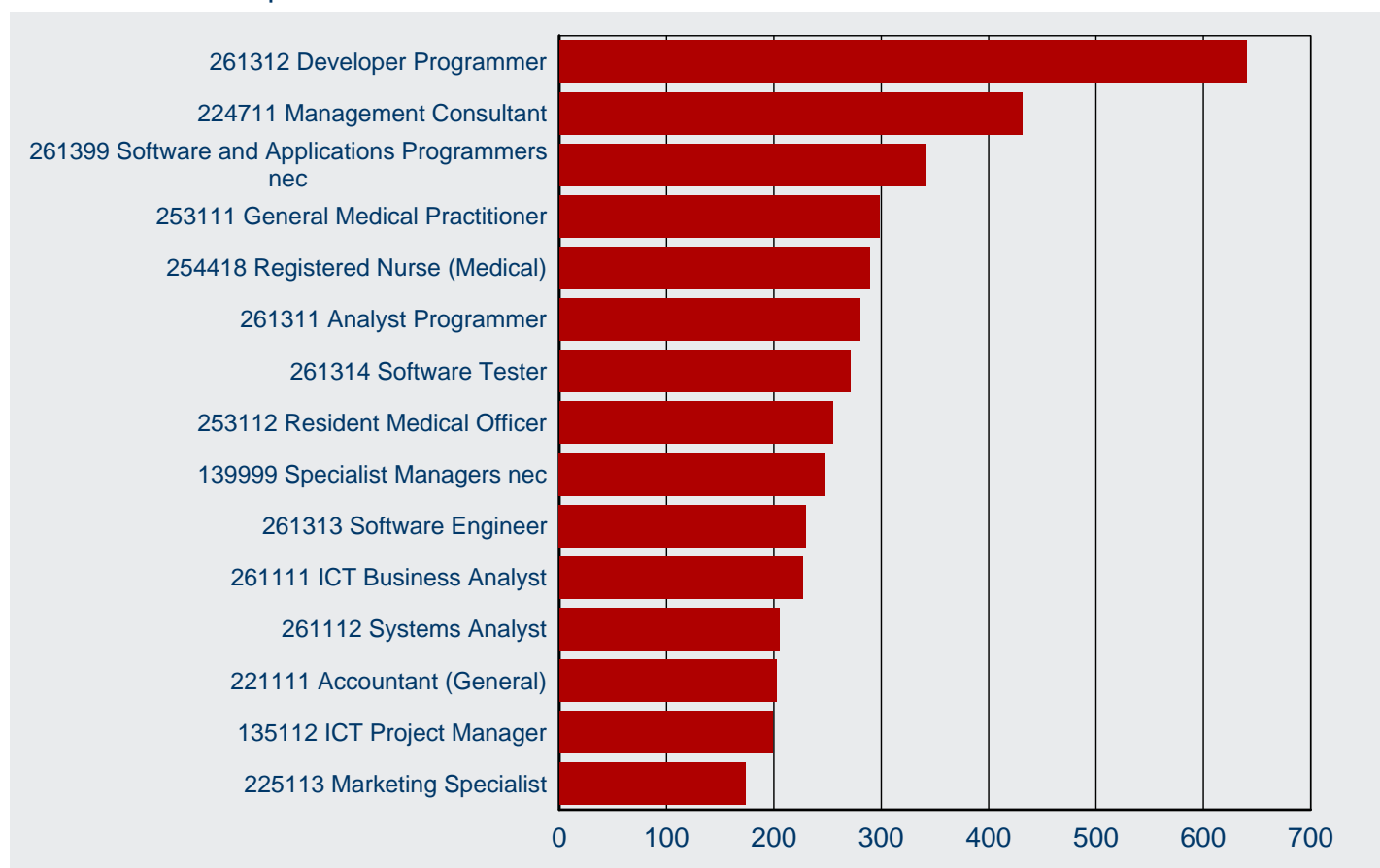

Graph 8.04 Top 15 Nominated occupations for primary applications granted in 2010-11 to 31 May 2011 - nominated positions located in Victoria

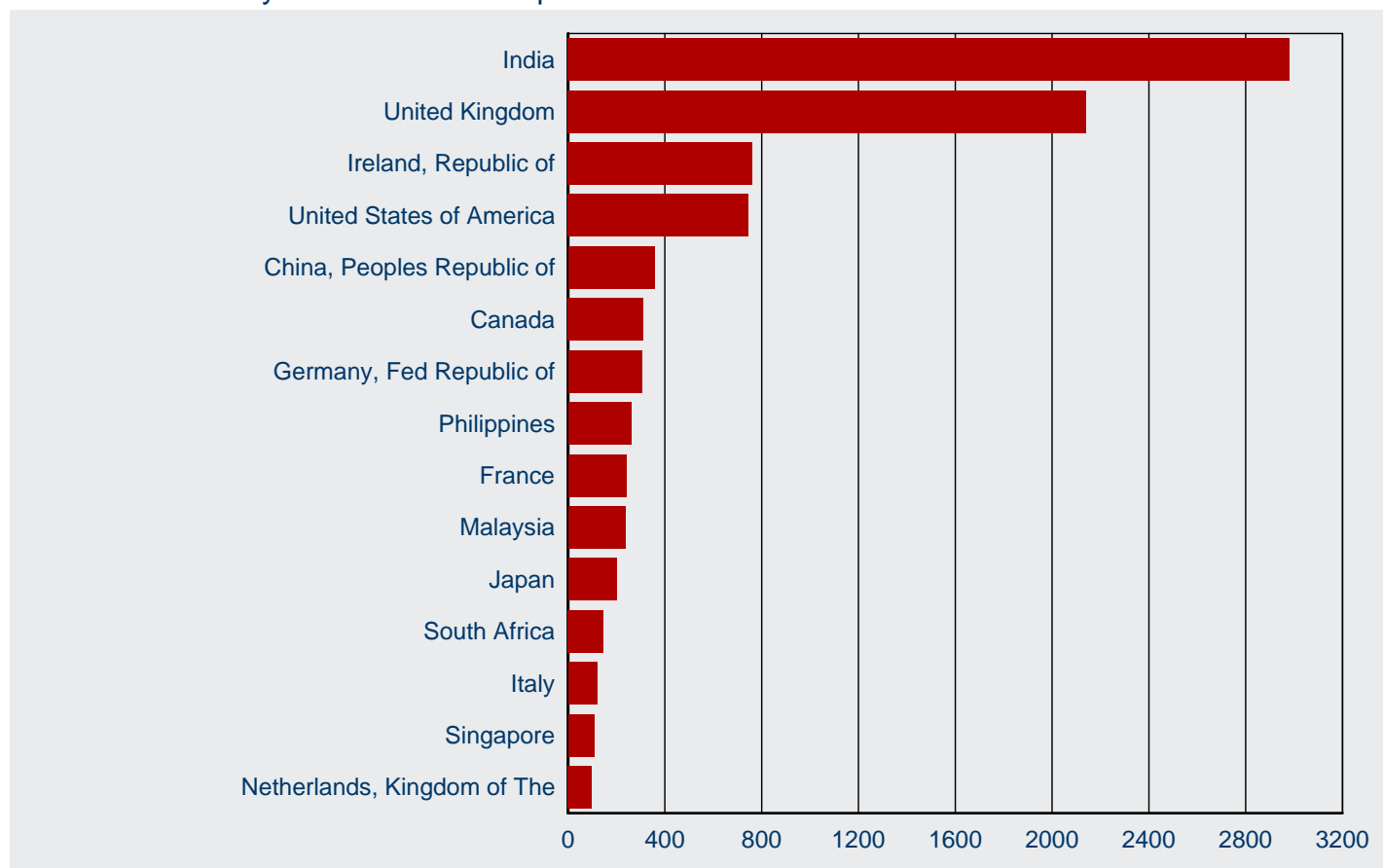

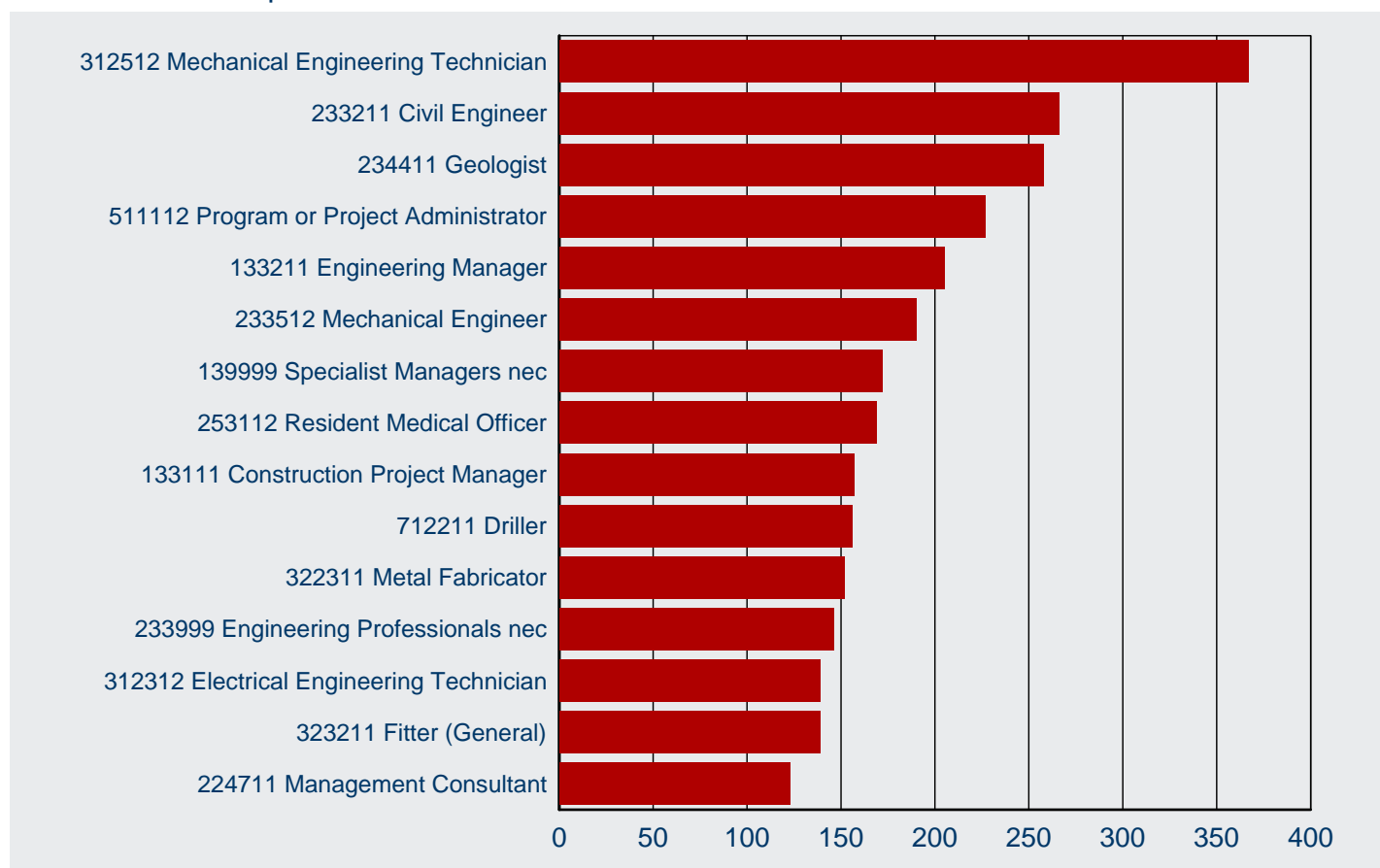
